#### **Treasurer's Report**

- Overall: church financial status remains strong, but credit for that must be given to the two PPP
  Forgivable loans the church received! The first, received in April 2020, was for \$100,710 (now
  forgiven) and the second, received in May 2021, for \$86,572. These have been or will be used
  exclusively to pay salaries (about ¼ for VNS staff).
- Congregational giving the past two months significantly increased compared to annual patterns and, thru June, is now almost identical with the first 6 months of 2020.
- Return rate for first half of 2021 on savings and restricted funds invested via Morgan-Stanley has been 8.72%

#### **Staff/Parish Relations Report**

SPRC will be reviewing staffing needs and responsibilities as the church returns to in-person worship. Staffing salary and packages will be reviewed during an August SPRC meeting. Prepare fall ministry teams.

#### **Trustees Report**

#### New Alarm / Access Procedures

- We will be publishing new procedures for everyone to sign off on who has a key or code. This is
  primarily to make sure that everyone is on the same page with the expectation of having a
  card/code.
- We are going to reset all the alarm codes at FUMC as of 9/1/2021. There are many codes floating around for people who no longer attend, some that have been mis-assigned, and some just configured wrong.
- If you need an alarm code, please contact Don Caddy (<a href="mailto:don.caddy@gmail.com">don.caddy@gmail.com</a>, 765-491-7855) to get one.
- Codes are 4 digit numeric, and you can "keep" your old code but you have to contact me to verify your contact information and code.
- If you already have one and you do not "renew" it then it will no longer work as of 9/1/2021.
- We have moved to a new access system. The old key fobs and cards will no longer work. If you need a replacement, please contact the office or Don Caddy.

#### Other News

- Building issues starting to be more of a concern as we open to more in person events
- Need to repair the sidewalk at the Kitchen Entrance. Estimate \$1,500
- Need to address the Booth AC as we open, they need to keep the doors closed and it gets very hot up there. Estimated about \$12k.
- Other than the office, the entire building is set to "unoccupied" for the most part. If you are having an event, please let Don Caddy know if you need the AC on.
- Might have a water leak in the line to the Columbarium. Water is turned off until we can address

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#### 2. Hearing Assistance

Our hearing assistance system has been dead for some time. There are new systems available that use the Wireless network so that people can either use their phones or a separate device that we could provide. This would require some upgrades to our current WIFI network. This is all still far less invasive or expensive as hearing loop systems.

This would support a system in the CLC and AC but not a sound system for the AC. Total Cost Estimated at \$14k

3. Wireless Network – Our current access points are going end of life and will need replaced in order to stay current with software patches.

#### **Care and Nurture Team Report**

We are meeting every two months to share information about our "buddies". Each member of the Care and Nurture Team is partnered with about 6 people. Most "buddies" are doing about the same. Covid seems to have kept people away from others and so healthier. The team is focusing on connecting with the elders and many of the church family. Over the last two months 43 cards have been sent, 25 calls

have been made, and 6 visits have been made. We make use of the Prayer List and send notes to those folks. We encourage members to send a card or make a call.

Carol made July 4th cards, which was a good way to connect. Carol's generosity is a key to this team's success. More cards are being sent than calls. The lack of calls is somewhat due to lack of response. We hope to be able to make visits soon. The next meeting is the second Wednesday of September.

#### **Communications Team Report**

The communications ministry is focused on improving FUMCs communication. The group has focused on two key tasks:

- Grant development to support strategic brand and marketing communications planning for the church.
- Ongoing content management for website

Items the group is celebrating!

- The team undertook a systematic review to determine a communication partner for our branding activity.
- Three companies were reviewed. Thee process included
  - Preliminary discussions
  - o RFP and Proposal review
  - Final interviews
- Following the review process, we decided on Smallbox https://www.smallbox.com/
- Grant submitted to Center for Congregations for 50% co-pay for branding activity. Announcement of grant funding to be made July 20, 2021.

Items the group is dreaming about:

- Having a website and communication program (newsletters, emails, social media) that is contemporary and meet the needs of the congregation (today and in the future).
- Extending our communications efforts to the broader community and supporting the growth of new ministries.
- Marketing/Communications support person (part time/hourly) to support expansion of the communication ministry.

**Upcoming Opportunities:** 

- Provide content: The website is a dynamic tool. Project leaders are encouraged to consider how
  they want their projects to be presented on the site. There is a blog function that allows topical
  news items to be featured we just need to know about them.
- Engage in the strategy development process: At the core of the brand/marketing communications strategy process will be a process of gathering insights from the church community. When the time comes - Your participation will be critical.

#### **Family Ministry Report**

Celebrate: The last couple of months have been active in Family Ministries. In addition to launching an informal, outdoor worship service that serves people of all ages, we successfully held an in person Vacation Bible School, a second Hometown Mission Trip (this time with 3 churches involved), two

summer youth activities, and a Virtual Popcorn and Painting activity with children. Delivering craft materials gives me the opportunity to have "front porch" conversations with parents and this has been helpful in getting to know our families. Because visitation is now allowed at Westminster Village, I have begun visiting residents and have been working to get to know our members.

Dream: First UMC has a wealth of talent within the congregation, both spiritual and intellectual. Successful congregations are led by disciples who develop disciples. We can only accomplish this if multiple leaders step forward and take responsibility for the discipleship of others. My dream is that the leaders in our congregation will participate in and lead Christian Education, developing new disciples and future leaders.

Invite: I invite people to take a small step in discipleship and offer to lead a Sunday School class or small group for our children, youth or younger adults. There are many resources available with step by step facilitation guides, which make taking this first step less overwhelming.

#### **Missions Team Report**

There is a lot to celebrate in missions! We had our first Bread for the World offering of letters campaign in June, supporting a more systematic approach to fighting hunger. Our congregation contributed 21 letters. We will also be holding our second Food Finders Food Truck on July 24 at Klondike Elementary School, being led by Denny Frank. You'll remember we originally did this in February, where we served over 100 families, and had enough extra funds to support this second truck.

Want to join us? We are looking for more people to join our missions team! We meet only once per quarter and have a lot of exciting opportunities coming up where we could use your gifts to help build more relationships with the people in our community.

#### **Nola Gentry Estate Committee**

We have assembled several folks for the team representing First Up worship, missions, children and families, and trustees. Seeking a representative from Celebrate worship.

#### **Stewardship and Generosity Team Report**

The Stewardship and Generosity Team has a working goal of producing 12 meaningful short videos about the life, successes, and futures of First United Methodist Church, one to be released weekly beginning the first week of September and ending the last week of November. Along with that, there will be written and live presentations and explanations about fiscal planning for 2022 throughout that period, with emphasis on generosity and the value of supporting First United Methodist Church.

Here is where we are in terms of identified topic areas, spokespersons already committed, and/or persons working on arrangements:

- John Polles presenting about music ministries
- Denny Frank presenting about missions
- Diana Hoke presenting about adult education
- Ashley Wien presenting about young family activities, organizations (there can be additional presentations in this critically important area)

- Ginny Dienhart presenting about older adults
- Leticia Mitchell leading arrangements for a TBD presentation about UMW In addition,
  - We still need people working on presentation topics and presenters for ministries about children, youth, and students.
  - We need conversation, advice, and planning about ministries and programs related to LGBTQ+ and underrepresented minorities.
  - The S & G Team presently is seeking input for six additional video topic areas beyond those listed above.
  - The team also is contemplating common-thread content for these videos beyond the individual creativity and enthusiasm that is being encouraged for presenters.

A tech-support team has been identified who will assist with video productions. Conversations indicate that the church presently has all of the technology needed to complete this project.

#### **Worship Team Report**
