The Great Thanksgiving

L: Christ is risen!

P: He is risen indeed!

L: Lift up your hearts.

P: We lift them up to the Lord.

Father, Son, and Holy Spirit; Source of Life, Living Word, and Bond of Love, you are creative and self-giving, generously moving in all the near and distant corners of the universe.

You are the One who meets us on the road, who walks beside us whether we wander or walk with intention, who is present in every step of The Way .

Nothing exists that does not find its source in you. Through fear-filled days and aching nights, when the powers of death have done their worst, your love has never deserted us.

When we have lost our way, you have found us. When we have wandered far, you wait, ready to run toward us. When we have reached the end of ourselves, you have shown us the way home.

Even when we turn away from you, you are with us; your presence never fails us, your gifts of hope and new life transform us.

We praise you for Jesus Christ, risen to life, eternal as your love—the One who is The Way , who walked the road of suffering and love, who met us at tables, on hillsides, in wilderness places, and who now leads us from death into life.

With the women at the tomb, we raise the strain of gladness. Hallelujah! Life is stronger than death!

The day of resurrection has come, scattering fear and gloom, revealing that no road is too long, no wandering too far, no ending too final for your grace to reach.

And so we rejoice with all your people of every time and place, with pilgrims and saints, with the great cloud of witnesses who have walked this way before us, and with angels and archangels, to proclaim the glory of your name:

P: Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

L: It is Jesus, God incarnate, the Risen Christ, who gathers us along the journey of the pilgrim's path and calls us into community—friends, family—a people who began as uncertain travelers but now have been found and are welcomed home. Christ Jesus, you meet us at the table, again and again, reminding us that we belong.

In this meal we remember you, your promises, and the price you paid --for who you were, what you said, and what you did—walking the way of love all the way to the cross, and beyond it.

On the night before Jesus died, he took a loaf of bread, gave thanks, broke it, and said, “Take and eat, whenever you do this, remember me.” After supper, Jesus took the cup, and poured, saying, “This is the new covenant, remember me.”

We do remember.

We remember your life of love, your companionship on the road, your welcome at the table, your dying, and your rising to life again. We remember that even in death, you were making a way— a way through the grave, a way into new life, a way that leads us home. In sharing this meal, we live out the mystery of our faith:

P: Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again.

L: Holy Mystery, God the Spirit, we call on you to transform these familiar things, as you continually transform the world around us. Walk with us still, as you did on every step of this Lenten journey.

Bless this bread and this cup— the wheat and the grape, the farmer and the harvest, the seed and the sower— and all who have walked the long road to this table, so that in the sharing of these simple elements --in community-- we may taste and see your goodness, and be strengthened for the journey ahead.

Make of us companions on the way— people of welcome, people of grace, people who know that no one walks alone. Through Christ, in Christ, and with Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory is yours, God most holy, now and forever.
